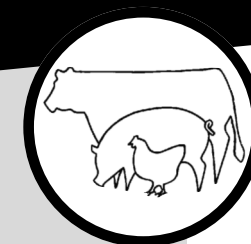

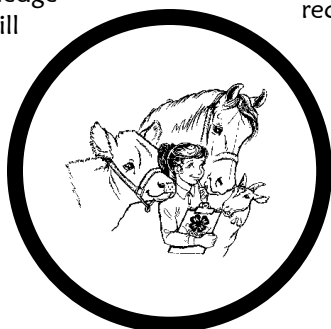

What are Project Interviews?

Livestock Project Interviews are conducted in order to evaluate each youth's knowledge of their project. These interviews will be held in collaboration with the project area skillathons held during the Hartford Independent Fair.

Youth members involved in 4-H livestock projects will be evaluated in at least two project station areas and a project interview.

Interviews will consist of a short question and answer period that will

focus on information about the project animal(s), the member's project work and activities, as well as an evaluation of their completed project and records.

The interview that takes place at each individual station will take no more than five minutes, for a combined judging time of not more than 20 to 25 minutes. At the conclusion of the interview process, members will receive an overall project score and grade based upon their performance within the selected stations.

Each interview judge will ask questions of the member and lead

discussion. Throughout the interview process, if questions are answered inaccurately judges will take time to explain the correct answer and elaborate on the information if time permits.

Why Should I Participate?

Youth participating in the interview judging program will experience satisfaction in demonstrating the knowledge that they have gained through their project work, while also gaining skill in communicating information about their project to others.
