Rules:

- 1. The contestant must be able to pedal the tractor without help.
- Pedal tractors will be furnished for all participants.
- All Contestants must wear shoes.
- The pulling tractor must stay between the lines of the pulling lane at all times.
- 5. If the tractor leaves the pulling lane the distance will be measured from the starting line to the point where the tractor crossed the boundary.
- The child may not place their hand on the tractor tire at any time during the pull to help increase their pulling distance.
- The child may not place one or both feet on the ground to push the tractor forward
- 8. There can be no loss of forward pressure. In other words, they cannot hesitate or absolutely never jerk the equipment
- The child will remain in the seat at all times. if a contestant lifts off the seat the pull will be stopped, and their distance will be measured to that point
- 10. The judge's decision will be final for all pulls.
- 11. All contestants must be present by the time of the pedal pull with assigned permission slip in hand. The required signature of parent or guardian

- releases all parties involved from any financial responsibility due to accident.
- 12. Child must be accompanied by an adult or guardian at time of registration.
- 13. Spectators must stay in the stands.
- 14. Arguing with the track officials by a contestant, parent, or guardian will not be allowed and could result in disqualification of the contestant, we will display sportsmanship in all cases, and should that not be possible the offender will be asked to leave. no one is perfect, but we will handle things in the proper way.
- 15. All rulings by track officials are final and may supersede any of the above rules. in the case of need a sled may be re-weighted and the group may start over.
- 16. Sanctioning: In OHIO the Sanctioned pull will qualify the top three participants in each age division 4-11 will qualify for the Buckeye State sanctioned Kiddy Pedal pull Championship held Saturday, August 14th in the Swine Complex
